- 1) **1 Samuel 3: 3**- God calls Samuel.
- 2) **Mark 1: 14 – 20** – Jesus calls His apostles. **Jesus said, “Come, follow me, I will make you fishers of people.”**
- 3) **1 Corinthians 13:1-8** – Paul teaches about love. **‘Love is always patient and kind’ ‘Love never ends’**

Some actions and symbols in the Sacrament of Confirmation and what they mean:

1) Confirmation is one of the **seven** Sacraments.

2) **The Sacrament of Confirmation helps the person’s relationship with God and the Church to be stronger.**

3) The person is old enough to renew the promises made at their Baptism. They promise to live as part of God’s family, following what Jesus taught with the help of the Holy Spirit.



5) The Bishop puts oil of chrism on the persons head. It is a sign of being called for God’s service. He says, **“Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit.”**

4) The bishop puts his hand over the person and prays that the Holy Spirit will guide them and make them strong in God’s love.



6) The person chooses the name of a saint who they look up to as a good example to follow.

Name

1) Prophet	A messenger of God.
2) Apostle	One of the 12 specially chosen disciples who were sent out to spread the Good News and lead others.
3) Holy Spirit	The third person of The Holy Trinity – Father, Son & Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit guides people to live in a good way like Jesus taught us.
4) Sacrament	A very special religious occasion when people become closer to God. It is God saying 'I am with you and I love you'.
5) Sponsor	A friend or family member that supports the person being confirmed with being part of God’s family.
6) Bishop	A priest who leads a group of priests within a collection of parishes (diocese).
7) Crozier	The long staff that a bishop has. It is like a shepherd’s crook. It is a symbol that a bishop cares for people like a shepherd cares for sheep.
8) Oil of Chrism	A holy oil used at Baptism, Confirmation and when becoming a priest.
